Mr. Somnath Das suggested that CRH should not function as corporate hospitals and that the primary mandate of CRH is to fulfil the NMC clinical requirement for 150 MBBS seats. Therefore, he expressed his dissatisfaction over poor free bed strength. Mr. Somnath Das suggested following immediate measures to be adopted by CRH functionaries:

MS: CRH HO: CRH

(a) OPD data from hospital clinics & Polyclinics to be mapped and anlysed (analysis to be projected in the next UMC)

(b) Distribute leaflet on free beds & other hospital schemes deep into the rural/ remote areas through the help of local bodies like panchayats, aanganwadi workers, MLAs, Municipal officials.

(c) As per the verdict of the Supreme Court on Rural Health Care Centre (RHCC), CRH should undertake public-private modalities to adopt RHCCs with GoS which have good inflow of patients. He recommended for timeline of 3 – 6 months to close the action in regard to RHCCs.

VC also apprised about his request to Health Minister, GoS on this issue, who had desired to set up a RHCC in his constituency. VC further requested Mr. Somnath Das to share the good practices and strategies at MTMC, Jamshedpur on RHCCs.

(d) Mobile clinics targeting the hinterlands be immediately initiated. Predicted schedule of visit by Mobile clinics to be publicized widely for the knowledge of the public.
